#### **PROGRESS REPORTS**

- **Canadian Automotive Manufacturing Pollution Prevention Project: Seventh Task Force Progress Report.** December 2000. This report demonstrates the continued commitment of the participating CVMA member companies to pollution prevention and the ongoing reductions in the targeted substances which result from implementing pollution prevention plans within plant facilities. In this report, 24 new case studies are highlighted, each of which varies in the degree of complexity, cost and implementation approach.
- **Automotive Parts Manufacturer's Pollution Prevention Project: Third Progress Report.** December 1998. In addition to twenty new case studies, this report provides achievements, ongoing activities and future directions of the project.
- **U.S. Automotive Pollution Prevention Project Final Progress Report.** November, 1998. This report highlights the significant progress by Chrysler, Ford, and General Motors in reducing the use, generation, and release of toxic substances, as well as other materials of concern. It continues to include release data of Great Lakes Persistent Toxic Substances (GLPTs) identified in the initial Auto Project.

- **Canadian Printing and Graphics Industry Pollution Prevention Project: Third Progress Report.** 1998. This report provides information about the project and its results by highlighting nine new case studies illustrating pollution prevention initiatives at participating company facilities, this report provides information about the progress of the Project, including achievements to date, ongoing activities and future directions.
- **The Green Clean Project.** A voluntary pollution prevention initiative to explore water-based cleaning as an alternative to non-aqueous solvents, particularly perchlorethylene (perc), used in the dry cleaning industry.

- **Comprehensive Municipal Pollution Prevention (CMPP) Project: A Guide to Pollution Prevention for Municipalities, December 1996.** (86 pages) The CMPP Project was established to demonstrate how pollution prevention could be incorporated into municipal government operations and programs. This guide was developed based on the experiences of the Regional Municipality of Hamilton-Wentworth (the Region) in developing and implementing its CMPP Project. It serves as a practical 'how to' reference for starting or building on pollution prevention initiatives in a municipality using a five-step process. This document provides examples of some of the Region's successes and outlines a planning and implementation strategy that can be used as a guide by other municipalities and agencies. . . . . \$15.00
- **Metal Finishing Pollution Prevention Project: Sixth Progress Report.** September 1999. Highlights of this report include 25 metal finishing companies are now participating in this Project.; 7 new case studies, for a total of 36, are included; 94 employees from 35 organizations have completed training in P2 planning; over 385 tonnes of additional waste reduced/eliminated are reported, for a project total of almost 2,571 tonnes; and \$82,000 of additional savings are reported, for a project total of \$628,250.
- **MOU for a Joint Canadian Chemical Producers' Association and the Ontario Ministry of Environment & Energy Pollution Prevention and Reduction Program: Stages 2 & 3 Report.** Stages 2 and 3 cover data management, development and implementation, opportunities and barriers. The tasks in these stages were addressed through the discussion and review of six site-specific pollution prevention and reduction summaries.

Market globalization, increased competition and better product quality mean that cutting-edge technology is vital to enabling Canadian industries to penetrate today's marketplace and export their products and services. Industry needs simple and effective tools to reconcile production demands with sound environmental management. The Simplified Process Audit (SPA) offers a solution. It allows plant administrators to foster a pollution prevention approach based, in part, on economic considerations, but focused primarily on environmental concerns. Pollution prevention fact sheets, produced by Environment Canada - Quebec Region, are available describing the audit methodology and its in-plant application.
- ***Environment Code of Management Practice (CMP) for Textile Care Operations, 1997.*** This manual will assist textile care specialists across Canada in creating more environmentally conscious processes in their plants. The focus of the CMP is to assist dry cleaners in creating management systems that identify opportunities for reducing the potential occurrence of environmentally damaging incidents, and the prevention of discharges of cleaning solvents and process waste products into the environment. ..\$12.00
